Extended Placement Program

The Extended Placement Program is a fantastic opportunity for students to spend an extended time in a rural area, enhance their knowledge of rural medicine and continue to develop their clinical skills. Previous EPP students have appreciated the opportunity to become part of a rural community and follow patients throughout the course of their illness.

How it works

The Extended Placement Program provides MD students with the opportunity to spend more time in a rural location, by doing the Rural & Remote Medicine and General Practice Placements back-to-back in CCP Placements in semester 1 or semester 2.

The Advantages

You will be living in a vibrant rural community for the two rotations (12 weeks), and you will become a part of it! You will be able to follow your patients through their primary and secondary care with enhanced clinical responsibility and work with all aspects of the health system.

You will have the opportunity to observe the complexities of individual patients with multiple medical problems through a holistic lens and be involved with these patients through an entire illness process.

Quality accommodation and internet facilities will be made available and provided free of charge to students. A Medical Educator will be available to support and assist you.

- Any previous experience living/working in a rural/ remote area
- Whether you have membership and active involvement with TROHPIQ
- Any attendance/presentations at events or conferences
 of rural significance
- If you have undertaken electives in other years of the MD program in a rural/remote area
- If you are a current rural scholarship holder eg. BMP
- What you can contribute and what you hope to gain from undertaking a rural/remote extended placement
- Any other information which would demonstrate an interest, in and commitment to, health in rural/remote communities
