Ochsner Medical Societies

Beginning in Year 1, all UQ-Ochsner students are assigned to one of five medical societies, named after an Ochsner physician founder, all of whom made important contributions to research, clinical care and/or education at Ochsner.

The five societies are:

- Edgar Burns Society
- Guy Caldwell Society
- Francis LeJeune Society
- Alton Ochsner Society
- Curtis Tyrone Society







Ochsner Medical Societies

Medical societies provide structure for educational advising and coaching from both faculty members and peers. Societies are also social units organized to promote a sense of community within the larger UQ-Ochsner cohort. Each medical society is led by a faculty member, the *Society Head*, who was chosen for expertise in advising and coaching.

Society Heads have the following responsibilities:



Monitor academic progress, professional growth, and work/life balance of individual students within their society.



Nurture social interchange between Years 1 & 2 and Years 3 & 4 students, and between students and faculty.



Lead the Ochsner Clinical School's advising and mentoring system by providing career advice and assisting students in finding specialty-specific advisors.



Provide formal four-year mentoring and coaching relationships with UQ-Ochsner students.



Assist students with the match process, including primary responsibility for writing the MSPE (Dean's Letter), and assistance with obtaining interviews.



Identify struggling students and assist the Deputy Director of Student Affairs in establishing remediation plans.








What is the USMLE?

United States Medical Licensing Examinations (USMLE)

The three step USMLE was developed by the National Board of Medical Examiners and the Federation of State Medical Boards to provide medical licensing authorities a uniform evaluation system on which to base licensure

Step 1 - Clinical Knowledge Prior to moving to Ochsner

Step 2 - Clinical Knowledge (Step 2CK) Between years 3 and 4

Step 3 - Application of knowledge within Clinical Medicine After Graduation

Keys to success learning approach to Step 1

Develop a study approach that is both effective AND sustainable

- Deep learning
- Self-Regulated Learning (Spaced Repetition)

Ability to apply learning to clinically relevant scenarios


- Developing a test-wise strategy

Introduction

To be licensed in the United States, physicians must pass the United States Medical Licensing Exam (USMLE) series. The exam is divided into three parts: The Step 1 Exam, the Step 2 Clinical Knowledge Exam, and the Step 3 Exam. The Step 1 Exam is a multiple-choice exam that you are required to take before beginning Year 3. The Step 1 Exam is now Pass/Fail, but this does not mean the content or difficulty of the exam has been modified in anyway. Instead, this change was made in an effort to reduce the stress during Years 1 and 2 of medical school and encourage residency programs to use a more holistic approach when evaluating applicants. The Step 2 Clinical Knowledge Exam is a clinically focused multiple-choice exam with results reported as a three-digit numerical score. Since Step 2 is now the only graded licensing exam that will be completed before applying to residency, its importance cannot be overlooked. The best predictor of a student's performance on the Step 2 Exam is their performance on the Step 1 Exam, so it is important that students prepare to the best of their abilities, beginning in Year 1 of medical school. The Step 2 Exam should be taken no later than April of a medical student's fourth year of school. The Step 3 Exam must be taken before the end of the internship year.

The USMLE website is an important reference that students should regularly review (www.usmle.org). Another very important resource is the Educational Commission for Foreign Medical Graduates website (www.ecfmg.org) which will direct you appropriately as a University of Queensland student.





Keys to success learning approach to Step 1

- Focus on the UQ curriculum in year 1
- Setting up good study techniques and habits
- 'DO' something with the learning activities each week: developing revision summaries, concept maps, flashcards
- Annotate relevant sections of First Aid
- Attend OMSA near peer tutorial
- TBL discussion









Preparation for USMLE Step 1 Stream

- Personal Learning Streams are an integrated part of your learning within MEDI7200 Developing Skills in Medicine
- Preparation for USMLE Step 1 Stream is specifically designed for MD students who are planning to apply for United States medical residency programs and licensing in the US to practise medicine
- Compulsory for year 2 students enrolled in the UQ-Ochsner MD program




