MEDI7100 Scheduled Teaching and Learning

Lectures

Facilitated learning sessions involving explanations, discussions, case analysis and application of knowledge

Integrated Symposia

Interactive learning sessions featuring experts from multiple disciplines collaborating to explore a theme from complementary perspectives

Clinical plenaries

Expert-led sessions designed to explore core clinical concepts, conditions, or patient journeys to build understanding of foundational clinical practice

Practical Sessions

Interactive, hands-on learning experiences in which students explore scientific, clinical, or technical concepts through direct experimentation, observation, and skill practice

Workshops

Applied learning sessions for development of competence, where students work collaboratively to test their understanding and refine their skills

Team-based learning (TBL)

Structured collaborative pedagogical strategy featuring pre-session independent learning and team-based application to develop clinical reasoning, communication and teamwork



Retaining your place in the MD program

For Provisional Entry Students only

Requirements

- Maintain GPA of 5 or above
- Complete the science prerequisites (equivalent to BIOM2011, BIOM2012)
- Complete **all requirements** of your undergraduate program
- Complete your degree in the minimum time

Process

- When results are officially released, the Faculty's Student and Academic Admin team will be assessing each record.
 This will take a few days.
- Once results are assessed, you will receive a confirmation and mySI-net record will be updated.

Examination hiccups

• If you need to defer an exam or sit supplementary assessment, you will need to have all grades finalised to commence the MD program by 24 January 2026.


Enrolling in the MD program

- The Medicine Program at UQ is a full-time, professional degree program which has a continuous enrolment
 program requirement. To ensure you are enrolled correctly, it is recommended you enrol for the entirety of 2026.
- Enrolments are now open, and you will need to enrol in the MEDI7100 course. However, there are multiple offerings of MEDI7100, so make sure you enrol in the one dedicated for your location (Brisbane, Rockhampton, Bundaberg, Toowoomba etc).
- Traditionally, enrolments will open for the following year at the end of November. Specific dates are available in the UQ Academic Calendar.
- Below is an example of what your enrolments will look like for the entirety of your program. However, please ensure you refer to your corresponding course list to identify the appropriate course codes each year.

Enrolling in the MD program



To enrol in your courses, you will use a system called **mySI-net**. This is the control centre for all things pertaining to Student Administration at the University of Queensland. mySI-net is the area where you enrol and drop courses, update personal information, view your grades and Studies Report, and request an Enrolment Status Report.

You can access mySI-net via your myUQ Dashboard.

You may be asked to complete some compulsory tasks before SInet will allow you to add your courses.

Α

The 'Part A' component (the Semester 1 offering) of your yearlong course will have an 'IP' (In Progress) grade assigned to it which will remain for the entirety of your studies within the program.

B

Your final grade for the course will sit in the 'Part B' component (the Semester 2 offering).



Enrolling in the MD Program

As our Doctor of Medicine program commences earlier than the standard University semester, it is recommended that you enrol in your courses as soon as you can, to avoid any delays or impacts on your commencement in the program.



The Faculty of Health, Medicine and Behavioural Sciences,
Student Administration Team are responsible for monitoring and assisting you with your enrolment and progression throughout the program.

ID Cards

As an MD student, you will need to obtain and always carry with you, two ID cards:

- Standard UQ Student ID
- Medical Student ID


The Medical Student ID card is often used as your primary identification as a medical student while on clinical placement or in hospital settings.


You can request both IDs through the <u>online form</u>, where you will be asked to upload a passport photo of yourself.

IMPORTANT: The Medical Student ID card is not automatically issued. Please make sure you indicate in your request that you are requesting both IDs or just the Medical Student ID (for students who have studied at UQ previously and already have a UQ Student ID).

If your UQ Student ID has expired, you can request a replacement ID card through the same form. Just make sure that your expected Graduation Term is up to date for your new program.


You will need your ID to access some teaching activities from Week 1 of Semester.



- You can enter your preference on the first day or the last day, with no impact to your chances of being allocated.
- You can change your preference at any time within the preference window.
- You must submit a minimum of 4
 preferences, up to 10 for Brisbane cohort.
 Rural cohort must enter all 3 or 4 options for preference.
- If no preferences are entered, you will be able to allocate yourself to a group which has space available.
- During the Swap period you can allocate yourself to another timetable pathway
 - Where you wish to move to a full class, click on the heart icon. It is not guaranteed you will receive the swap



Your Support Teams



HMBS Placement Ready Team

- Communicate with students participating in WIL about what requirements they need to complete.
- Verify student compliance submissions (except immunisations).
- Answer queries from students about compliance requirements.
- Send reminders to students for Documentation.
- Send compliance reports to Schools



Immunisation Record Team (IRT)

- Verify student immunisation compliance submissions
- Answer queries from students about immunisation requirements.
- Advise students on next steps regarding their immunisation requirements
- IRT are the only ones that can access and view your immunisation evidence.

Current Varicella vaccination shortage in private sector Tip: vaccinate in your home country, or provide a letter detailing documented history of physician diagnosed chickenpox or shingles

Immunisation Evidence

Disease with immunisation or screening requirement	Type of evidence
Pertussis (whooping cough)	Vaccination within last 10 years
Measles, mumps, rubella (MMR)	2 vaccinations or evidence of immunity to all three diseases
Varicella (chicken pox)	2 vaccinations or evidence of immunity
Hepatitis B	Full age appropriate vaccination course and evidence of immunity
COVID-19	Evidence of vaccinations is required for some programs and/or placements. See Table 1 and COVID-19 information below.
Tuberculosis	TB self-assessment form and if required latent TB screening
Blood borne viruses (BBVs)	Exposure prone procedures statement completed by your medical practitioner
Influenza	Annual vaccination is strongly recommended during flu season (from April/May) and mandatory for some placements.

Work Integrated Learning Requirements (WIL)



You are required to complete and provide evidence of the listed requirements within the specified deadlines



Deadline: Friday, 27 February 2026

Criminal History

- Complete relevant criminal history checks by October/November
- Recommended: AFP Police Checks
- Not Accepted: QLD Police NPC (Privacy & verification issues)
- Compliance varies: Domestic (AFP), International (AFP + Stat Dec), Ochsner (AFP+ FBI + PreCheck).
 Please see website for full details.

NDIS/Blue Card

- Apply in person at TMR for a CRN
- Submit a combined application for Blue Card + NDIS
- Use correct portal: Apply via Disability Worker Screening, not Blue Card Services
- Upload details: Add Blue Card reference number in InPlace (this is different to your NDIS Application and or Screening ID)

First Aid/CPR

- First Aid is valid for 3 years
- CPR must be renewed every year
- Overseas certificates accepted if HLTAID011 equivalent
- Accepted: Red Cross, St John International, Heartsaver®

Queensland Health

- Complete iLearn modules and upload iLearn transcript
- Complete/upload Student Orientation Checklist
- Complete National Hand Hygiene Initiative (NHHI) Modules and upload completion certificates
- **Student Deed Poll** to be submitted from Year 2


